Prices for field trip/museum day + conference per person

Arrival

By car: A46, coming from the west, take exit 33 W.-Katernberg, turn right onto Briller Str. and after approx. 1 km turn left onto the B7; coming from the east, take exit 35 W.-Barmen, continue straight ahead on Carnaper Str. and after approx. 1 km turn right onto the B7; after approx. 2 km, at the Media Market turn onto Bendahler Str., the Bible Museum is located just behind the railway underpass on the right-hand side.

By train: ICE/Eurostar station Düsseldorf Central, then take train lines RE4, RE13, S28 or ICE to Wuppertal Central or the S8 to Wuppertal-Unterbarmen. It is about a 10- to 20-minute walk to the Bible Museum.

By plane: Düsseldorf Airport DUS 45 km away, approx. 40 minutes by car; Cologne/Bonn Airport CGN 60 km away, approx. 45 minutes by car to Wuppertal.

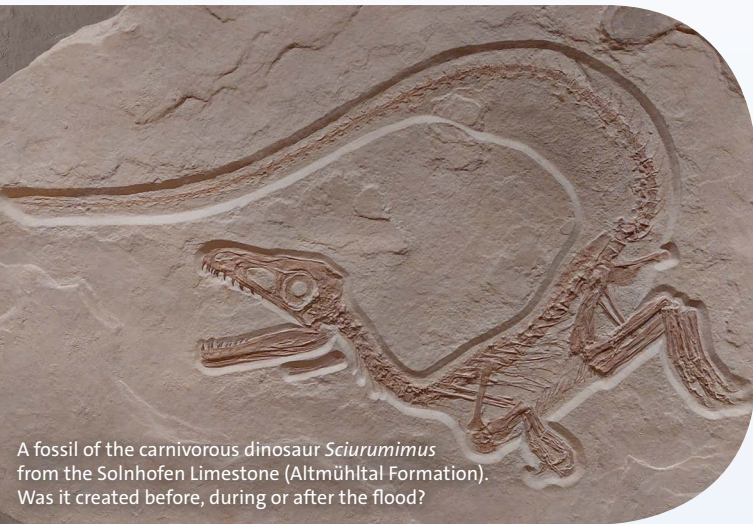
